

Directive 2002/96/EC – The WEEE Regulations

The Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment ('the WEEE') Regulations have now been passed into UK legislation. The regulations became enforceable from January 2007.

The regulations require that electrical and electronic equipment that does not have a fixed location and was placed on the market after 13th August 2005 must be clearly identified as such. Carbolite Limited have marked those Carbolite products to which the regulations apply with the 'Wheelie Bin' symbol in accordance with BS EN 50419:2006 – 'Marking of electrical and electronic equipment in accordance with Article 11(2) of Directive 2002/96/EC (WEEE)'.

The regulations also require that Carbolite Limited register as a producer of such items and make provisions for the collection and recycling of such equipment placed on the market after 13th August 2005 within the UK. Consequently Carbolite have joined an industry compliance scheme managed by B2B Compliance Ltd and have been allocated the Producer Registration Number: WEE/CJ0525WW. Details of collection and recycling arrangements are available at the address above or via email from WEEE@carbolite.com. This only applies to equipment supplied within the UK.

Carbolite Limited., fully recognise that the recycling of electrical and electronic equipment is beneficial to the environment and as a responsible organisation will in addition to the above provide advice on the responsible disposal of Carbolite products.

Where Carbolite equipment is supplied through a distributor to other countries of the EU, it is understood that the 'producer responsibility' resides with that distributor.
